1. Correspondence.

2. Revenue

It was suggested we encourage all our current members who are EQ coaches, to suggest their students join NEDD for coaching insurance purposes. All agreed this was a worthwhile idea and could benefit both clubs – with NEDD’s doing the official classes and NAGs hosting the social classes. At present Tasch had managed to secure the services of judges, however as we borrow NAG’s arenas, holding a competition on our own is difficult. As the NEDD club needs to generate income to enable purchase of our own equipment, it is important we are not compromised financially by NAG’s discount system.
